CASE SUMMARY

In the Statement of Claim, Claimant asserted the following causes of action: breach of fiduciary duties; fraudulent concealment of material information; gross negligence; negligent misrepresentation; and violation of FINRA Rule 2010. The causes of action relate to May 2020 West Texas Intermediate Futures contracts.

Unless specifically admitted in the Statement of Answer, Respondent denied the allegations made in the Statement of Claim and asserted various affirmative defenses.

RELIEF REQUESTED

In the Statement of Claim, Claimant requested compensatory damages of at least \$3,918,040.00; pre-judgment interest at the 9% per annum New York statutory rate; reasonable attorney's fees, expert witness expenses, costs, expenses, and FINRA filing fees; and such additional relief as the arbitration Panel deems proper.

In the Statement of Answer, Respondent requested that the Statement of Claim be denied in its entirety.

At the close of hearings, in addition to restating its request for damages of \$3,918,040.00, plus pre-judgment interest of 9% per annum, Claimant presented several alternative damages computations.

OTHER ISSUES CONSIDERED AND DECIDED

The Arbitrators acknowledge that they have each read the pleadings and other materials filed by the parties.

The Award in this matter may be executed in counterpart copies.

AWARD

After considering the pleadings, the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, and any post-hearing submissions, the Panel has decided in full and final resolution of the issues submitted for determination as follows:

- 1. Respondent is liable for and shall pay to Claimant the sum of \$1,881,500.00 in compensatory damages.
- 2. Any and all claims for relief not specifically addressed herein, including any requests for attorneys' fees, are denied.
